About the Rover Platform

- Rover's services for pet owners include pet boarding, house sitting, drop-in visits, doggy day care, and dog walks, which are available in the U.S., Canada, and eight European countries. Rover's on-demand dog walking service, Rover Now, is available in 20 cities in the U.S. and Canada. Rover Grooming is available in Seattle and Austin.
- Every new sitter on Rover must pass a general background check and safety quiz before listing their services, and each profile has been reviewed and approved by Rover. Rover team members constantly respond to any concerns and other feedback to ensure that pets are receiving safe and high-quality care.
- Sitters and dog walkers get access to the tools, support, and continuing education they need to offer outstanding individualized care. In the rare event that an incident occurs during a stay, our trust and safety team is available 24/7 to offer advice and connect sitters and walkers with veterinarians. The trust and safety team includes former veterinary technicians, 9-1-1 operators, police officers, and pet insurance adjusters.
- For each day care stay, dog walk, or drop-in visit, pet parents get a notification when their care provider arrives and receive a Rover Card at the end. Rover Cards include fun photos or videos of their pet, meals eaten, potty breaks taken, service start and end times, and if applicable, a map of their dog walk.
- Paying through Rover is cashless, convenient and secured.
- It doesn't happen often, but if a sitter or dog walker cancels at the last minute, we'll help pet parents find a new one. If there's a price difference, we'll help cover that too.
